



BLUE LEVEL EQUAGILITY January 2025

This is a two phase class, there are only five obstacles to negotiate. First you must complete the five obstacles on the ground with a halter and leadrope, a rope round the neck OR at liberty then you mount the horse and ride through the obstacles at the same pace as on the ground you can use one rein which cannot change sides and/or rope around the neck.

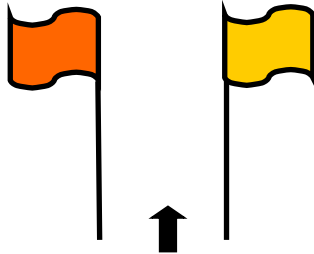
For safety bridles and saddles are allowed (with or without trees), you may use a bareback pad (no stirrups) or saddle blanket and surcingle or ride bareback. If you use the bridle rein you will lose marks. You may have a neck strap or neck rope on the horse for safety.

The filming must be continuous without a break between the groundwork and the ridden part so put any saddle onto your horse before you start. You may wish to put the bridle on between the groundwork and the ridden work. **THINK SAFETY AT ALL TIMES. DO NOT TAKE CHANCES** you will not be judged on your riding style but your ability to be with your horse as he carries you around the course.

Closing date for entries is 31st JANUARY 2025 WHEN YOUR ENTRY IS RECEIVED SAFELY BY THE CLUB OFFICE YOU WILL BE SENT A UNIQUE ENTRY CODE. IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE THIS CODE PLEASE CONTACT THE CLUB BY EMAIL - YOUR ENTRY IS NOT VALID WITHOUT THIS CODE. . REMEMBER you must keep your lead rope loose and keep moving forward between obstacles with no circling. If you do have a tight lead rope, rein or neck rope, a stop or circle **BETWEEN** obstacles you will lose a mark from the next obstacle's score.

Groundwork: using lead rein, neck rein or liberty.

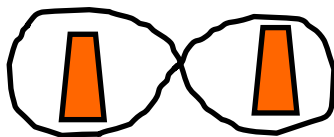
Ridden: one rein attached to the halter/headcollar which cannot change sides, rope around the neck
THIS COURSE IS THE SAME AS ORANGE WHERE YOU CAN HAVE TWO REINS ATTACHED TO A HALTER, ONE REIN THAT CAN CHANGE SIDES AND A ROPE AROUND THE NECK. IT IS ALSO THE SAME AS INDIGO WHERE ONLY A NECK ROPE IS ALLOWED.



4. Weave. Horse and handler to weave at trot through five cones together.

3. Narrow flags. Create a narrow gap with two flags. The top of the flags must be higher than the horse's ears. It should look and feel like a squeeze. Lead your horse through safely. Handler can be anywhere on the ground.

2. Tarpaulin. Horse and handler to trot over tarpaulin together.

5. Figure 8. Two markers are placed one horse length apart. Horse and handler to lead horse around these markers in a figure eight pattern. Handler is at the horse's shoulder during the groundwork section.

1. Pole halt and backup. Walk front feet of horse over pole and halt (the pole will be under his belly). Then, back horse up over pole then walk on over pole. Feet must not touch the pole at any time.
