THE JUDGE MUST HEAR THE REAL SOUND! DO NOT INCLUDE MUSIC OR A VOCAL COMMENTARY REMEMBER SAFETY FIRST! CLOSING DATE MIDNIGHT ON 31st July 2025 WHEN YOUR ENTRY IS RECEIVED SAFELY BY THE CLUB OFFICE YOU WILL BE SENT A UNIQUE ENTRY CODE. IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE THIS CODE PLEASE CONTACT THE CLUB BY EMAIL YOUR ENTRY IS NOT VALID WITHOUT THIS CODE. REMEMBER you must keep your lead rope loose and keep moving forward between obstacles with no circling. If you do have a tight lead rope, stop or circle BETWEEN obstacles you will lose a mark from the next obstacle's score.

5 and 6. Create a weave using 5 cones or other markers. Horse and handler to weave through cones **maintaining chosen leading position** until they reach the middle, marked with a star shape. Halt for 2 seconds then continue weaving. Ensure the halt is **BETWEEN** the cones and not before or after it. **FOLLOW THE RED LINE!**

This month's course is built in a special way. Obstacles are built together in pairs PLUS there is a time limit on completing the course. If you go over the time you will lose one point for every full ten seconds over. **The time limit on the Starter Level course is 5 minutes.**

3 and 4. Build an scary corner with scary things on both sides. The corner should be a right angle (90 degree bend). Horse to walk **QUICKLY** into the scary corner and at the corner go into a **SLOW** walk and leave the corridor as slowly as possible. Handler can be anywhere safe. Make sure we can see clearly.

START

7 and 8. Place a pole on the ground across the curtain base. Horse to pass through curtain and step over pole without touching the pole. Handler can be anywhere.

1 and 2. Place a small mat approx. 1m x 1m (3ft 3in x 3ft 3in) **NEXT** to a tarpaulin with no gap between them. Horse walks onto mat with his front feet and stops on it for a count of one before continuing over tarpaulin.

9 and 10. Place a pole on the ground at the start of a pole corridor. The width of pole corridor is 1m/3ft. Guide the horse's front feet over the first pole, halt then back the horse up over the pole then continue over pole and through the corridor. Horse must not touch poles at any time, handler can be anywhere.
