



RED LEVEL EQUAGILITY August 2025

This is a two phase class, there are only five obstacles to negotiate. First you must complete the five obstacles on the ground with a halter and leadrope, a rope round the neck OR at liberty then you mount the horse and ride through the obstacles at the same pace as on the ground. For the ridden section you can use any of the following two reins attached to a halter, one rein which can change sides, rope around the neck For safety bridles and saddles are allowed (with or without trees), you may use a bareback pad (no stirrups) or saddle blanket and surcingle or ride bareback. If you use the bridle rein you will lose marks. You may have a neck strap or neck rope on the horse for safety.

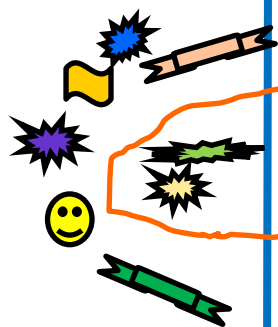
The filming must be continuous without a break between the groundwork and the ridden part so put any saddle onto your horse before you start. You may wish to put the bridle on between the groundwork and the ridden work. **THINK SAFETY AT ALL TIMES. DO NOT TAKE CHANCES** you will not be judged on your riding style but your ability to be with your horse as he carries you around the course.

Closing date for entries is 31st August 2025 WHEN YOUR ENTRY IS RECEIVED BY THE CLUB OFFICE YOU WILL BE SENT A UNIQUE ENTRY CODE. IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE THIS CODE PLEASE CONTACT THE CLUB BY EMAIL -YOUR ENTRY IS NOT VALID WITHOUT THIS CODE. REMEMBER you must keep your lead rope and reins/neck strap loose and keep moving forward between obstacles with no circling. If you do have a tight lead rope/reins, stop or circle BETWEEN obstacles you will lose a mark from the next obstacle's score.

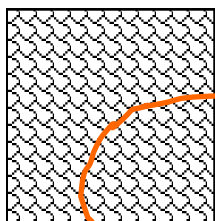
Groundwork: using lead rein, neck rein or liberty.

Ridden choice of two reins attached to a halter, one rein which can change sides or rope around the neck THIS COURSE IS THE SAME AS GREEN WHERE EQUIPMENT ALLOWED IS ONE REIN THAT CAN CHANGE SIDES AND A NECK ROPE

This month's course is all about FLOW! During groundwork section the handler MUST STAY ON THE INSIDE/IN THE MIDDLE OF THE TWO BLUE LINES (these don't need to be physical lines, we can imagine) as they guide the horse around the course. The horse must follow the path of the ORANGE LINE in both groundwork and ridden.



4. Scary corner. Build a SHARP corner made up of things normally scary to horses on both sides. Horse to walk through safely.



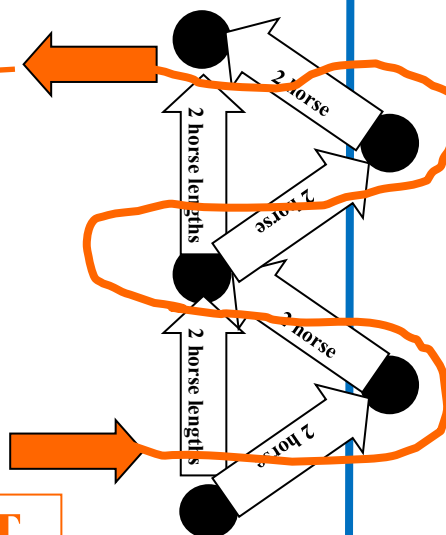
2. Bottle bank. FILL a square of poles with plastic bottles or scrunched up balls of paper or similar. You will lose marks if we can see the floor. Horse to walk through the square following orange line.

1. Weave. Create a weave pattern as in the diagram using cones or other markers to create a weave with two horse lengths between them. Horse to walk through cones following the red line as marked on diagram. Handler can be anywhere inside of blue line.

FINISH

5. Narrow gap. Only just wide enough to safely fit horse and rider, with solid sides to the floor (we must not see horse's legs or feet through the sides) and must be at least half a horse length long. Height not lower than horse's knee. Horse walks through.

3. Tarpaulin. Place two poles on the edge of the tarpaulin, shown as red lines on the diagram Horse to walk over poles.
