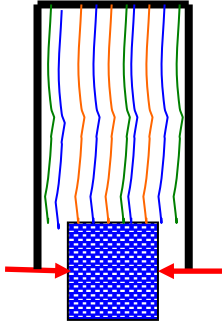


WALKING ONLY Silver Liberty Trophy January 2026

You may choose each month to compete at any level. There is no promotion system in place. You may use a neck rope on your horse but when you use it to control or manoeuvre your horse you will lose points. No halter/headcollar on horse.

THE JUDGE MUST HEAR THE REAL SOUND! DO NOT INCLUDE MUSIC OR A VOCAL COMMENTARY REMEMBER SAFETY FIRST! CLOSING DATE MIDNIGHT ON 31st JANUARY 2026 WHEN YOUR ENTRY IS RECEIVED SAFELY BY THE CLUB OFFICE YOU WILL BE SENT A UNIQUE ENTRY CODE. IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE THIS CODE PLEASE CONTACT THE CLUB BY EMAIL YOUR ENTRY IS NOT VALID WITHOUT THIS CODE. REMEMBER you must keep your lead rope loose (if used) and keep moving forward between obstacles with no circling. If you do have a tight lead rope, stop or circle BETWEEN obstacles you will lose a mark from the next obstacle's score.



6. Curtain.

Lead horse through curtain safely at walk.

7. Halt.

After the curtain, halt your horse. Handler moves to the horse's right shoulder and stands still there for a count of three. Horse should not move feet. Both then walk on together to the next obstacle.



8. Hula Hoop Walk.

Place a hula hoop onto the ground. Horse to walk over it without his feet touching. At least one foot must step into it. Handler is on horse's right side. Make sure we can see this clearly or you will lose marks.

5. Mat.

Place a small mat approx. 1m x 1m (3ft 3in x 3ft 3in) halfway through the curtain. Horse walks onto mat with his front feet and stops on it for a count of one before continuing.

9. Weave.

Horse and handler to weave at walk through five cones. Handler is at horse's shoulder throughout.

4. Tarpaulin.

Horse and handler to walk over tarpaulin together with handler at horse's right shoulder.

1. Gate

Create a gate (using two uprights and piece of rope) or use a real gate, it can open in either direction. Ask your horse to wait, open the gate and go through it, count to five then ask your horse to join you. Close the gate.

2. Pole halt. Lead front feet of horse over pole, halt (the pole will be under his belly) for a count of three seconds.

3. Backup. Back horse up over pole then walk on over pole. You will lose marks for horse touching the pole with his feet.

10. Narrow flags. Create a narrow gap with two flags. The top of the flags must be higher than the horse's ears. It should look and feel like a squeeze. Ask horse to wait, handler goes through flags, counts to three then asks horse to join him.
